There are currently two NIHR funding opportunities open: standard researcher-led workstream; and Applied Clinical Research on Very Rare Diseases. For the purpose of this call, a very rare disease is one that affects less than 1 in 100,000 of the general population, particularly those whose specialist care is provided through centres funded by the National Specialised Commissioning Group (NSCG) and equivalent arrangements from April 2013.
